Cellular and mobile high speed Internet services expanded on King's Highway 108 near Elliot Lake as a result of Ontario Government, NetCentral and Rogers working together

Second Rogers cell site at Elliot Lake provides access to mobile high speed Internet and cellular services for motorists, residents, businesses, students and tourists

Elliot Lake, March 12, 2013- Residents of Elliot Lake and motorists travelling on the King's Highway 108 south of Elliot Lake near the Elliot Lake Airport now have access to expanded cellular and mobile high speed Internet services thanks to a unique public-private investment in a new Rogers cell and wireless high speed Internet site.

Funded by the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC) and Rogers in partnership with NetCentral Community Communications Network (NetCentral), the new wireless cell site was officially commissioned today. The site provides cellular and mobile high speed Internet services via Rogers High Speed Packet Access (HSPA plus(+) technology.

NetCentral is the not-for-profit, community-based Information and Communications Technology (ICT) organization serving the Greater Sudbury, Elliot Lake, Chapleau, Manitoulin Island, Sudbury East and Parry Sound regions. NetCentral identifies gaps in cellular, mobile broadband and ICT services and works with the service providers to improve telecommunications services for Northerners.

During 2011, NetCentral secured funding commitments of \$3.9 million from Rogers and \$11.9 million from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation (NOHFC), an agency of the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines (MNDM), to fund the wireless expansion and improvements to deliver advanced telecom services to Northerners. This cell site near the Elliot Lake airport plus the Rogers tower north of the City on King's Highway 108 that was commissioned in December 2012 are part of the 24 new HSPA+ cell and mobile high speed Internet sites being funded by Rogers and NOHFC. The remaining 14 HSPA+ sites will be deployed in 2013 and 2014 in Sagamok First Nation, Temagami, Hwys 11, 63 and 64 and on Manitoulin Island.

"I'm very pleased that through the NOHFC, we have been able to bring improved cellular phone service and wireless high speed Internet to residents, students and businesses in the Elliot Lake area. This will mean better access to on-line educational, health, government and business services," said Northern Development and Mines Minister Michael Gravelle.

"We are extremely pleased that NetCentral, with the generous support of NOHFC and Rogers, can bring expanded cellular service and mobile high speed Internet to the residents of Northern Ontario," said Jim Gordon, founding Chair of NetCentral. "Our goal is to ensure that Northern Ontario residents have access to the same telecommunication services as residents in Southern Ontario."

Elliot Lake Mayor Rick Hamilton welcomed the expansion of cellular and wireless high speed Internet services to the community: "This new tower provides much needed cellular and high speed Internet services along the Highway 108 corridor south of Elliot Lake and at the Airport just as the new tower north of the City services the increasing number of permanent residents living and working in the Quirke and Dunlop Lakes region," said Mayor Hamilton.
